A NOTE FROM HOPE WARFEL, LGG GHELDREN'S DERECTOR


I have some confessions to make. I don't like crafts. I don't like making them, my kids generally aren't very "in" to them either, and I have never understood why my kids constantly bring home silly crafts they made that are destined for the recycle bin ten seconds after they walk in the door. I am hoping there is a mom or two out there who can relate and that you are not all judging me for my cynical anti-craft attitude! Someone even told me recently that as a children's ministry director I am practically required to like crafts. Uh oh.

If you have a child in our 1st-5th grade classes, you may have noticed an increase in craft projects coming home with your child. It wasn't my idea. It just came along with this awesome new curriculum you keep hearing me talk about to anyone who will listen. But as I have tried to really dig into this curriculum, and have been doing some teaching as well, I finally had a huge lightbulb moment! I know those of you who are teachers are going to think I am ridiculous for just catching on to this, but here is what I discovered. The crafts are not to impress me, or for me to have another cute piece of my kids artwork to hang on the fridge. Nope! They are totally, completely, 100% about helping the children learn! Who knew? Not me apparently.

We all know that there are many learning styles. Lecturing seems to be the one that reaches the brains of the least people. But of course, we still have to lecture. So to make that lecture stick, we reinforce it with a hands on activity that will stimulate those precious brains in a different way.

So a few weeks ago your children brought home their interpretation of the parting of the red sea with sand paper, blue tissue paper, and foam stickers. More recently, they made replicas of the Tabernacle (aka Ark of the Covenant) with pipe cleaners (Arron's rod), manna (saltine crackers), and the 10 Commandments (construction paper with scribbles). Some weeks our craft may only be a coloring page. The point is, we are going to use every tool we have to reach your child's head and heart.

Now, what will we do with all these additional crafts flooding into our homes? That is between you are your children! Let me know if you come up with any great solutions!


Nursery
